# **UNFORGIVING SERVANT:**

#### Intent of the Session

✓ To help the participants to forgive others

## **Target Audience**

<u>Any group</u>: Especially children, youngsters and youth.. <u>Any occasion</u>: Catechism Class, Moral Instruction, Recollection, Retreat, Camp, etc

# PROCEDURE;

#### Step 1. The Parable of the Unforgiving Servant (Mt. 18/21-35)

- ✓ Read the passage of Mt. 18/21-35
- ✓ Or ask the Participants to read it very carefully by themselves
- $\checkmark \quad \underline{\text{Or have it acted by some of them.}}$

## Step 2. Personal Work and Reflection.

Write a few lines on the following questions:

- (1) Do you think that St. Peter was too generous by being ready to forgive the same person seven times? Why?
- (2) Would you be willing to forgive a person doing you wrong, seven times in a row if he asked you for pardon? Why? Have you ever forgiven anyone several times over?
- (3) What do people normally do with those who, time and again, keep insulting them or treating them badly?
- (4) What did Jesus want to teach Peter and us all, by means of the parable of the "Unforgiving Servant"?
- (5) How many times does God forgive us? Does God keep an account of the times we sin? Why?
- (6) If God had to forgive us only seven times, could we be his friends now? Could we ever hope to enter heaven? Why?
- (7) How many times will Jesus forgive us at Confession?
- (8) So, what have we to do, to be like Jesus, to be like our Heavenly Father?

#### Step 3. Discussion in smaller Groups

If the number of participants is large, say more than 8 or 10, divide them into small groups of 5 or 6 each

Ask them to share and discuss their written replies on the questions given above.

#### Step 3. Personal Examination

# **<u>A PERSONAL QUESTIONNAIRE FORM:</u>** (For all Participants)

- ✓ Individually, think and reply in writing to the points below. -
- ✓ You will not be asked to share your personal reflections. They are meant only for your personal improvement.
- $\checkmark$  Keep them with you and take them home. Later on, read them, from time to time.
  - (1) Is there anyone, in your life, you did not forgive or you found it very hard to forgive? Explain.

- (2) Is there anything we can do to find it easier to forgive those who wrong us? Give some suggestions.
- (3) What do you intend doing after today's session to forgive others?
- (4) How do you feel whenever anyone, Mum, Dad, Husband, Wife, Teacher, Friend or someone else forgives you? Give some instances of your life.
- (5) How do you feel when others do not forgive you, take revenge or stop talking to you? Give instances.

## **Step 4. (Optional) ROLE PLAY. Short Skits Inspired in the Parable of the <u>Unforgiving Servant</u> (Mt. 18/21-35)**

- ✓ If you have time available, do not sip this step. It's a very effective means to drive home the main learning of today's sessions.
- ✓ Ask each small group to prepare a small skit inspired in the Parable of the "Unforgiving Servant" put in modern setting.
- ✓ Make it relevant to the audience. Instead of a King, it can be a Manager, a big Boss, the Police, the Judge, The School or College Principal, The Parents at home, a friend, etc.
- ✓ The thesis or argument of the skits will be: <u>I have been forgiven so much and so many</u> <u>times by God and people, that I have to forgive others the wrongs they may have done</u> <u>to me.</u> For example:
  - <u>At Home</u>: Forgiving your brother...sisters....the servants.
  - <u>In School</u>: Forgiving your classmates, your teachers etc.
  - <u>On the playground</u>: forgiving your team-mates, play-mates.
  - <u>On In the Office</u>...
- $\checkmark$  You need the following cast:
  - A Narrator
  - A Boss, an authority figure, Rich Man, a Parent, a Friend, etc..
  - The Unforgiving Servant
  - The Forgiven Servant
  - A few more characters to act as co-servants, coworkers or companions
- $\checkmark$  The skits will be presented to the entire house.
- $\checkmark$  After each presentation, a short evaluation and discussion may follow.
- ✓ The evaluation will be based not in its artistic value, but on its expressive and message value.

# Step 5. Closing Prayer: Points for Prayer:

- ✓ Silent personal prayer.
- ✓ Read again the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant
- ✓ Ask the Participants to read over and over again, all by themselves, the reflections they wrote in their personal questionnaire forms
- $\checkmark$  You may encourage them to spontaneously pray aloud.
- ✓ End by singing some hymns of your choice.
